
This data is based on diversity and inclusion responses provided by 92.51% of individuals via our Human Resources Information System, this data was then used to respond to the SRA Survey.




Those who consider they have a disability according to the definition in the Equality Act 2010:





Those who consider their day to day activities are limited because of a health problem or disability which has lasted, or is expected to last, at least 12 months:








Sexual Orientation



What type of school was attended between the ages of 11-16:




Did either of your parents attend university and gain a degree (eg BA/BSc or equivalent) by the time you were 18?




Occupation
