Hannah Cockroft OBE, PLY, DL, is seven-time Paralympic Champion, and one of Britain's best-known para-athletes. Hannah made her senior debut for Great Britain at 18 years old, representing her country at the World Championships in New Zealand in January 2011. Hannah became double World Champion in the T34 100m and 200m. Hannah represented Team England in the Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games. She brought home gold in the T34 100m in front of a roaring home crowd, completing the set of gold medals at every major athletics championships.



Kevan Baker OBE

Chief Executive of SPINE and
Former Paralympic Athlete

Kevan has been Chairman of WheelPower for 25 years . As an athlete Kevan is a two time bronze medal winning Paralympian in Discus and has been a great role model for people with spinal injuries. A former World Record Holder, he also won Gold on 3 occasions at International Wheelchair Games at Stoke Mandeville.



Nathan Maguire

Commonwealth Champion and Paralympic Athlete

Nathan Maguire is a T54 wheelchair racer, competing in 100m, 200m, 400m, 800m & 1500m. He was paralysed from the waist down after a sudden case of Transverse Myelitis, aged 8. This however, has never stopped him and since then he has competed at 3 European Championships, 2 World Championships, Gold Coat 2018, Birmingham 2022 Commonwealth Games as well as the Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020 Paralympic Games.
